Crowd - I worked as the Crowd team trainee for three and a half months. I assisted in fittings, dressing, standby checks, alterations, and the general maintenance of costumes and equipment. I was also able to experience both prep and wrap in this department. This role demonstrated and developed my abilities in time management, organisation, communication, people skills, and overall resilience. Workroom - I was in the workroom for two and a half months, and worked mostly in hand sewing. I had the opportunity to learn more about the CAD programmes and processes of machine embroidery. During this role I was able to refine my sewing abilities, and experience the expectations and atmosphere of a professional workroom. Runner - This position afforded me the broadest view of how the costume department functions and collaborates with its six divisions. In my time as the Runner I was responsible for collecting & distributing deliveries, assisting in store rooms, running errands, and more infrequent tasks such as ironing and button making. This role allowed me to demonstrate my abilities in organisation, and willingness to take direction. Craft - My month in the Craft rotation improved the speed and precision of my work, and taught me new techniques in millinery, leather work, jewellery, and fabric painting. Principals - As the Principal trainee I gained a further month's experience on set. In this role I assisted in setting up and clearing dressing rooms, cleaning and mending costumes, and standing by to retrieve or provide anything required by the team on set. During this rotation I exhibited my ability to follow instructions efficiently and effectively. Break Down & Dyeing - Towards the end of the traineeship I worked in the Break Down department for a week. During this time I developed my skills in dyeing, airbrushing, and created a variety of blood and puss fabric samples.
